

Hello Friend,

A few weeks ago, I wrote an <u>op-ed that was published in the Cincinnati Enquirer</u> explaining the immediate need for a moratorium on evictions for nonpayment of rent. After receiving funding from Hamilton County to provide relief to those who are behind on their rent and utilities, CAA and our partnering agencies have been flooded with calls, many from tenants who have already had eviction cases filed against them. I was thrilled to hear today that the Center for Disease Control has issued a nationwide eviction moratorium because the pandemic "presents a historic threat to public health."

Tenant unable to pay rent due to loss of income or extraordinary out-of-pocket

expenses;

Income is less than \$99,000 (or double that if filing a joint tax return);

- Tenant would become homeless or forced to live in close proximity with others if evicted;
 Tenant will still make partial payments ("using best efforts to make timely partial
- payments that are as close to the full payment as the individual's circumstances may permit, taking into account other non-discretionary expenses.").
- The moratorium will last through December 31, 2020. This is a really bold step and should give families who are behind on their rent time to connect with available resources without the fear of being evicted. What we need now though are more resources for rental and utility

assistance, so that families don't come out on the other side of the moratorium owing back rent that they cannot afford to pay. Thank you all for your dedication and support.
